Mastering Maths!

There is lots of work going on across school to help all our children to master maths. We use concrete resources such as counters and cubes so that the children can 'do' the maths and then we move on to using pictorial representations so that the children can 'see' the maths. We are also working on fluency and helping the children to become fluent in aspects of maths including number bonds and times tables. Your child can practise their maths at home in many ways – one of the best ways is to 'teach' you at home. Please encourage your child to take on the role of the teacher at home! All children should also have a login for TTRS, and we strongly encourage them to practise











Fun Snack Friday

Each Friday, our EYFS team prepare a 'Fun Snack Friday' treat for the children. They do this to introduce them to a variety of foods and to discuss the origin of foods. 'Fun Snack Friday' also promotes a cultural awareness amongst the children.
