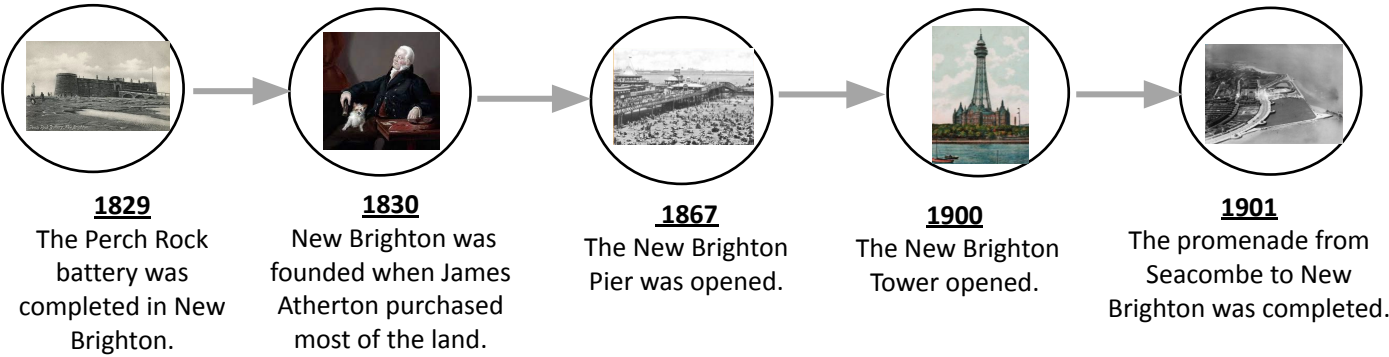

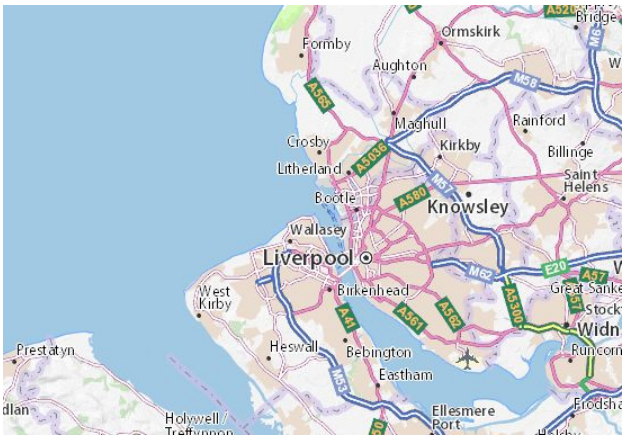

## VOCABULARY

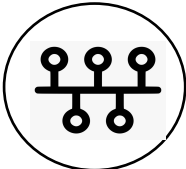
- Chronological**  
A record of events following the order in which they occurred.
- Significant**  
Something sufficiently great or important to be worthy of attention.
- Pageants**  
A public entertainment consisting of people in costumes or an outdoor performance.
- Local**  
Relating to a particular area, usually your neighborhood where you live.
- Promenade**  
A paved public walk, typically one along the seafront at a resort.
- Regeneration**  
The act or process of coming back, making something new that needed to be improved.

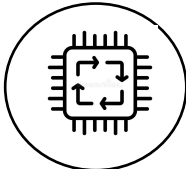
Understanding why the different events are significant enough to make New Brighton a popular seaside town throughout these years.
